A devised play based on Shakespeare's Twelfth Night

The Dell, Stratford-upon-Avon

26 July 2015 at 12 noon

Twelfth Night has been transported to a modern day Scotia (a not very well disguised Scotland) whilst retaining the characters and themes of the original. The cast worked together to re-write their lines in modern speech, except for the two characters who come from 'Shakespeare Land' – Viola and Sebastian – who retain the original dialogue, although it has been shortened somewhat.

Devising a play in this way has proved to be an interesting and exciting experience. The cast has had 'ownership' of the play from the beginning and have developed their characters as they re-wrote their lines. This has meant that the rehearsal period has been more enjoyable for all concerned.

Twelfth Night was Shakespeare's most musical play. Its opening line "If music be the food of love, play on" strongly points to this. Throughout the play, Shakespeare used songs to heighten some of the poignant moments, or to emphasise comedy. In our production, it therefore seemed fitting that *Duke* should be a somewhat faded rock star, seeking solace in music with his musician friends. His household is characterised by a more melancholic musical style reflecting his lovesickness, while *Toby*'s debauchery lends itself to a more upbeat soundtrack. We have chosen modern music that we hope reflects Shakespeare's original musical choices and captures the character of the play.

What...You Will? was first performed by the Linlithgow Players as an outdoor production in Linlithgow, Scotland, in April, as part of the RSC Open Stages project. Our delight at being chosen to take part in the RSC Open Stages project has now been surpassed by being given this opportunity to perform our play here in Stratford. We hope you enjoy it as much as we have enjoyed devising, rehearsing and performing it.

Linlithgow is an historic town in central Scotland, best-known as the birthplace of Mary, Queen of Scots
